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ABOUT THE PECULIARITIES OF SHOLOKHOV'S CREATIVE MANNER

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Abstract. This article examines the peculiarities of the language of the works of the talented Russian writer, winner of the Nobel Prize in Literature Mikhail Alexandrovich Sholokhov.
